**Secretary's minutes** Al made motion to accept. Dave seconded. Approved by all with changes.

Discussion on Vouchers, Calendar Money is a coding issue.

Councils were made aware of not meeting requirement of charitable percentage. Metro Life Members, Central Council and Western Plains Councils made the objective.

**Awards received:** for Minnesota Bags project, Excellence in Fundraising.

**Calendar** - Letter from Chairman Roger Hanson dated February 27, 2010.

Again 2010 the sales of the Caring and Sharing Calendars declined.

While a part of the problem is caused by membership mortality, this is an opportunity to raise more money for the individual Councils than any other project I have heard of.

I have assembled a Spread Sheet that shows the results of the last three years. We have lost money two or the last three years. It is time to look at our options and the Executive Board needs to make some decisions regarding the future of the calendar program.

I believe our options are:

1. Quit selling the calendars.

A. It is an answer. However, a great deal of some council's annual income is produced by calendar sales.

B. Examples: Metro Life -\$1500.00, Central- \$1320.00, Western Plains-\$1035.00.

2. Reduce the Prize Money for the Major winners.

A. If we reduced the \$500.00 prizes to \$300.00 we are only saving \$800.00.

B. That savings is insufficient to solve the current problem.

3. Reduce the Councils compensation for selling calendars.

A. It is our opinion, that reducing calendar compensation would cause the active Councils to sell fewer calendars.

B. Many of the leading Councils have two or three people who work at selling the calendars. How do we achieve a more active sales force?

4. Tie the number of scholarships to the Sales.

A. If we tie the number of Scholarships to the sales of calendars, we could have a viable program.

There may be other options.

As Co-chairmen we can only make suggestions for the board to consider.

The only thing certain is we cannot continue as we are now.

1<sup>st</sup> quarter 2010 EZ Help 911 Cell Phones for Seniors project report

40 cell phones given to the Anoka County Sheriff's department, and received 5 boxes of cell phones from them. They are also going to expand their cell phone distribution with my assistance now that I am retired.

White Bear Lake received 50 cell phones and collected 4 boxes of cell phones for us.

Bloomington gave us 6 boxes of cell phones. Their request for cell phones is down considerably due to many seniors now have their own, but they still promote the project in their weekly, monthly and video programs within the City.

5 boxes of unusable cell phones were recently sent for recycling with GRC which will be a little over \$1,000 to be used for local community projects.

Next distribution in White Bear Lake will be in April.

- Sunday, July 25 (check-in) — **Alexandria, Minn.**
- Monday, July 26 — **Little Falls, Minn.**
- Tuesday, July 27 — **Pequot Lakes, Minn.**
- Wednesday, July 28 — **Wadena, Minn.**
- Thursday, July 29 — **Fergus Falls, Minn.**
- Friday, July 30 — Cyclists ride down the Central Lakes Trail to the finish in **Alexandria, Minn.**

Campers will camp in the area of Pillager for 4 days and drive each morning to their designated rest stop area.

**Wheel Deals – on a Qwest for a Cure**


To date 3 of our 8 riders have registered on the MS TRAM participant website. Roger is working on recruiting a 9<sup>th</sup> rider as well.
